A preposition is a word placed before a noun or pronoun to show its relation with others words in the text. A preposition always has an object.

**Prepositions are used before nouns to give additional information in a sentence. Usually, prepositions are used to show where something is located or when something happened.**

Prepositions showing :

Location	Time	Action and Movement

under	before	into

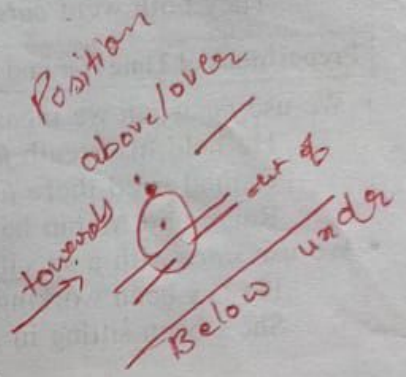

**Prepositions of Time : at, on and in**

- We use **at** to show specific time, e.g.  
The train is due **at** 5.30 p.m.
- We use **on** to show days and dates, e.g.  
My father is coming **on** Monday.  
We're having a party **on** the tenth of October.
- We use **in** for nonspecific times during a day, a month, a season or a year.  
She likes to jog **in** the evening.  
It's too cold **in** winter to run outside.  
He joined the job **in** 2003.  
He's going to quit **in** March 2013.

**Prepositions of Place : at, on and in**

- We use **at** for specific addresses, e.g.  
Kamla lives **at** Lodhi Road in Delhi
- We use **on** to designate names of streets, avenues, etc., e.g.  
Her house is **on** Mahatma Gandhi road.
- We use **in** for the names of land-areas (towns, counties, states, countries and continents), e.g. She lives **in** Agra.

**Prepositions of Location : in, at and on and no Preposition**

IN	AT	ON	NO PREPOSITION
(the) bed*	class*	the bed*	downstairs
the bedroom	home	the ceiling	downtown
the car	the library*	the floor	inside
(the) class*	the office	the horse	outside
the library*	school*	the plane	upstairs
school*	work	the train	uptown

\* You may sometimes use different Prepositions for these locations.

**Prepositions of Movement : to/ towards and No Preposition**

- We use **to** in order to express a movement towards a place, e.g.  
They were driving **to** work together.  
She's going **to** the doctor's clinic this morning.
